In the spring of 1998 a group of local artists, with a deep breath and a leap of faith, decided that art education, based in Dawson City, was an idea whose time had come.

They formed the *Dawson City Arts Society (DCAS)*, a non-profit organization, with a mandate to create an environment for advancement of the arts.

To fulfill their mandate, DCAS' founding Directors envisioned a school called the *Klondike Institute of Art & Culture (KIAC)*.

KIAC is a campus-based centre offering a broad range of high quality Community, Continuing Education and Professional Development programs

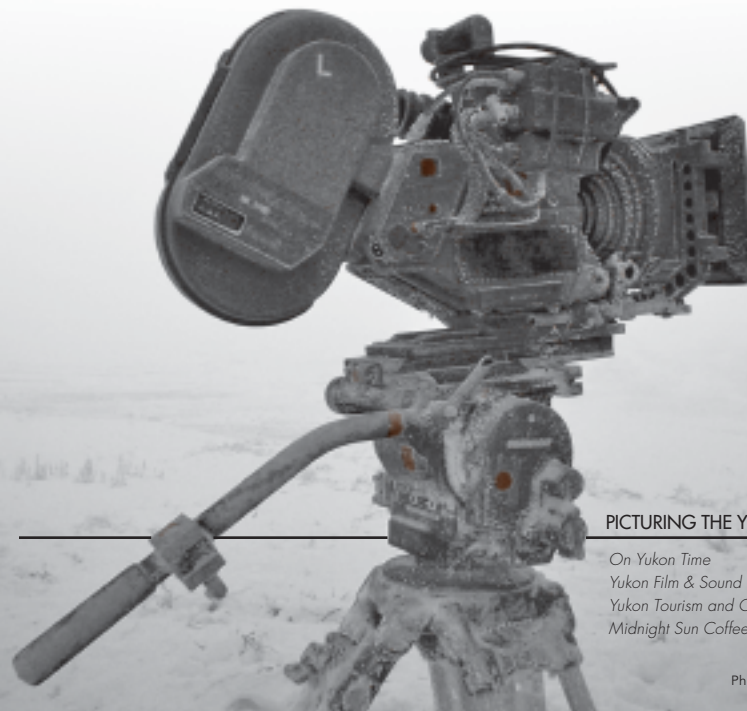
WHITEHORSE. 6 DAYS & NIGHTS. FEBRUARY 25 TO MARCH 5, 2007.

1. SEAWEED STUDIOS

- ▲ isolated control room
- ▲ isolated drum booth
- ▲ separate storage area for instruments cases etc.
- ▲ Hot Tub and BIG coffee machine!
- ▲ All rooms have been tested for standing waves and acoustically treated appropriately with good sound

2. OLD CROW RECORDING

Owned by Juno Award winner Bob Hamilton, Old Crow Recording is the Yukon's longest serving independent recording studio. The 48 track studio is

located in a semi-wilderness setting on the Alaska Highway, just minutes from downtown Whitehorse. For full equipment list, visit our website.

3. RAINBOW RECORDING STUDIO

- ▲ 225 sq ft. Control Room
- ▲ 600 sq ft. Main Room with 16-foot vaulted ceiling
- ▲ 200 sq ft. Isolations room with a large window overlooking main room
